PARKING

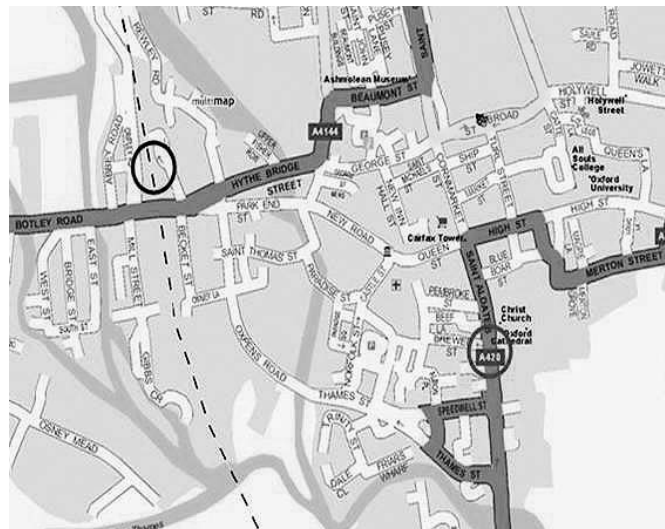
