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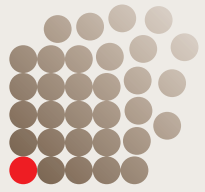

Management of oral and dental care for service-users in forensic psychiatric custodial settings and in the community

What is forensic psychiatry? The assumption that mental disorder is a cause of crime is open to challenge. Published research has highlighted that the oral health of those with psychiatric illness in institutions is poor and also poor in comparison with non-institutional individuals. Dentists and their team are often called to provide oral and dental care to these service-users in the primary care setting. This course will provide an update on the management of those with forensic psychiatric illnesses in custodial environments and in the community. The course should be of interest to all dentists and their teams and brings together consultants in forensic psychiatry and dentists who have experience in providing care to these service-users.

The morning session is devoted to providing awareness in forensic psychiatry, psychiatric management and care pathways for service users in custodial settings and the community. The afternoon session examines practical management with case scenarios, an update of the Mental Health and Mental Capacity Acts and risk assessment. This is followed by the dentist's experience in providing care to these service-users. There will be opportunities for discussion with the speakers and networking with colleagues during the day.

Educational aims and objectives

At the end of the study day, attendees will:

- have an understanding of the demography of people with forensic psychiatric illness in custodial settings as well as an updated knowledge of forensic psychiatric illness;
- have an updated knowledge of the Mental Health and Mental Capacity Acts in relation to providing dental care;
- have an updated knowledge of risk assessment in relation to providing dental care; and
- have an updated knowledge of the management of oral and dental care of people with forensic psychiatric illness.

This course will be of interest to the whole dental team in special care dentistry, prison dentists, general dental practitioners and MJDF trainees. **This study day will attract 5 CPD credits.** Please return your completed application form to the Education Department (address overleaf).
